- ▶ "If you have an apple and I have an apple and we exchange apples, then you and I will still each have one apple. But if you have an idea and I have an idea and we exchange these ideas, then each of us will have two ideas."

What is Koha?

- ▶ Koha is the first open source ILS developed in 1999 and released in 2000
- ▶ Koha is managed by a worldwide community of developer and users who love libraries
- ▶ Koha is a fully featured web-based ILS
 - Includes all the modules you need to run your library: Circulation, Patron Management, Cataloging, Acquisitions, Serials, Reports and various tools

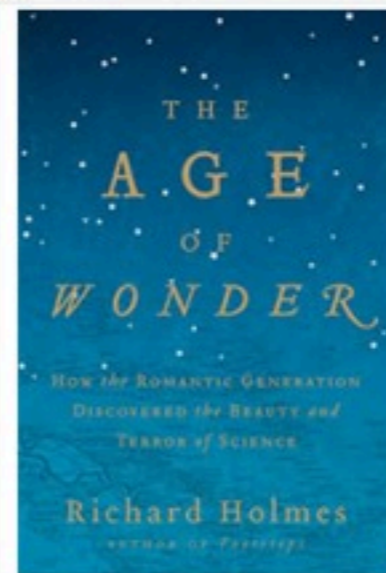
